

Dog's Name: Is used to get the dog's attention. The dog should look at you and keep focus on you until you give the next verbal cue. *A dog's name should not be used as a verbal correction.*

Okay: This command is used to release the dog. Whether it be to eat their food, move from an implied stay, or get off of place.

Go Potty: This command instructs the dog to go potty immediately.

Kennel: Is used to instruct the puppy to get in its kennel and remain there until given a release or other command.

Wait: Is used to have the dog "wait" for a short period of time. Like before being given the command to eat their dinner, stopping at the bottom or top of stairs, and/or not crossing a threshold.

Sit: This command tells the dog to sit on its bottom and focus attention on their handler.

Down: This command tells the dog to lay down on its belly

Let's Go: This command tells the dog to walk next to you in either a side or a heel position, but not pulling ahead or lagging behind.

Give: Tells the dog to bring the item it has in their mouth and place it in your hand.

Touch: Tells the dog to touch their nose to the inside of your palm. Can be used to move the puppy into a different position and will be used in formal training to target.

Dress: Tells the puppy to place its head through their vest or gentle leader.

Here: This command tells the dog to come directly to you and sit in front of the person calling them.

Leave It: This command tells the dog to ignore an item, person, or other distraction and focus back on their hander.

Place: Tells the dog to go to a particular bed or mat and remain there until released.

Shake: This command tells the dog to place one of its paws it the hand of the person extending it.

Stand: This tells the dog to stand on all four paws and not continue walking around.

Car: This tells the dog to jump inside a car.

Side: This tells the dog to move to your *right* side and remain in a stand position until given the next command.

Heel: This tells the dog to move to you *left* side and remain in a stand position until given the next command.



Under: This tells the dog to lay down under your legs horizontally.

Go In: This tells the dog to go underneath an item, turn around to face you, and then lay down.

Jump On: This command tells the dog to jump on to an elevated surface with all four paws. For example: a bed, couch, elevated surfaces, etc.

Off: This command tells the dog to get out of a car, off an elevated surface, or to take its paws off of something.

Up: This command tells the dog to place its front two paws on a counter, table, wall, etc.

Rest: This tells the dog to rest its head on your lap until told to stop.

Lay On: This command is done when the handler is sitting on the ground with their legs out in front of them. The dog should lay its body across the handler's thighs.

Implied Stay: Commands highlighted in red mean that the dog should "stay" in that position until given another command. The stay command **should not** be said.
